Re. Application for renewal of DOT-E 11406

The Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors, Inc. (CRCPD) requests the U.S. Department of Transportation to renew Special Permit SP-11406, currently the seventh revision dated May 5, 2006 which is to expire April 30, 2010.

The following information is provided as required by 49 CFR 107.109 on application for renewal.

In regard to specifications in the exemption, the CRCPD makes no request for revision.

Except that terms and citations were updated by DOT staff with respect to 49 CFR, the descriptions, the technical information and the safety assessment that were submitted with the original application of January 1995 and with subsequent requests for extension remain accurate and correct.

Shipments under the exemption may be authorized only by those state radiation control officials who are registered to do so with this office (SP 11406 & 1). The list of these officials is maintained, and updated as necessary, on [www.crcpd.org](http://www.crcpd.org) under Radioactive Material Services, Transportation.

Each shipment under the exemption must be reported to the CRCPD Executive Director (SP 11406 & 7e). CRCPD received approximately 251 shipment approvals under SP 11406 during 2009, of which all were for highway vehicles. The radioactivity identified in these shipments included several smoke detectors and other radium items of low activity but most reports were of I-131 and Tc-99m in medical patient waste.

No accident involving cargo under this exemption has been reported to this office.
